"Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil." Ephesians 5:15-16

Scripture is filled with warnings about falling away from the Faith. In the Greek language (the language the New Testament was written in), the word for falling away is quite often in the passive tense. What this means is that a Christian can fall away, not because he chooses to, but because he is neglectful. It is such a simple thing to stay in the Word - reading it, studying it, hearing it. Yet, as simple as this is, it is the most difficult art for the Christian to master, for the devil constantly tempts us to neglect God's Word, and our own flesh is weak and easily drawn away. It is surely true that, were God not on our side, none would be saved. He does not let Satan have his way, but fights for us to keep us with Christ in the one, true Faith.

Keep me, O Lord, among the assembly of those who gladly hear Your Word. Let not the devil nor my sinful flesh draw me away from Christ. Allow me to walk as one who is wise. Amen.
