"These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb." Rev. 7:14

Yesterday we celebrated the Reformation; today All Saints. Yesterday was the church militant; today the church triumphant. Going from one day to the next, for us, is easy. We simply flip the page in our calendar. But in reality, going from the church on earth to the church in heaven is a struggle.

"Through much tribulation," is how the Scriptures put it. The tribulation comes because we are now a part of the church militant. We're in the fight. Our struggle is against the powers of darkness.
