From the Pastor...

Nothing good comes from missing church. Just ask Thomas. He wasn't there with the other disciples on Easter evening when Jesus made His appearance. This was their worship service. Jesus was present to bless, with His gifts, those who were gathered. The others sought Thomas out and told him they had seen the Lord. But he refused to believe. Why not? Because he had not been in church with them. He had not received the same gifts which Jesus had given to the others. Had Thomas missed church a week later, he would never have believed. But God, in His mercy, drew Thomas to that gathering,

appeared to them again, again gave them His gifts, and now Thomas believed.

Every good comes from being in church. Maybe it's a little like going to the gym (although the church is not a gym, but more like a hospital). I've heard people say that they hate going to the gym, but

afterwards they are glad they went. When Jesus came to His disciples, He forgave them, He gave them the Holy Spirit, and He showed them the proofs (the scars) of His crucifixion. He does the same for us in our worship services. He comes to forgive us. He speaks the same word of peace and pardon to us as He did to His disciples behind locked doors. He gives us the same Holy Spirit so that we are strengthened in our faith and life. And in His Holy Supper He shows us the nail marks in His hands and feet, for when we partake of this Sacrament *we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.*

Jesus' disciples were able to live the risen life only because their Risen Lord kept coming to them with His gifts again and again. This is just as true for us. We are no match for our sinfulness, for the world's temptations, for the power of the devil. We need the Risen Christ to come to us again and again in our worship services, through Word and through Sacrament, to bless us with His gifts. How wonderful, therefore, that this is what He does.



Daily Devotion

"And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, He interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself...They said to each other, 'Did not our hearts burn within us while He talked to us on the road, while He opened to us the Scriptures?" Luke 24:27, 32

For so many people, the Scriptures are a closed book. They don't read them, perhaps, or come to church much. But most of all, the Scriptures are closed because the Risen Lord, for them, is not in them. If the Bible isn't about Jesus then it's worthless. If God's words are just rules to follow and interesting stories, who needs them! But the Bible is all about Christ from cover to cover. Jesus says so. Every bit of it is about Him. Jesus is the Word of God. And so when we sit and read, or sit and listen, the same Lord who conquered sin, death, and hell is coming into us, and He can handle any trouble, any sin, any depression and guilt that dwells within us.

The Scriptures are open for us when we believe, by God's working within us, that Christ died for us, that He is risen, that He has baptized us into His death and resurrection, that He comes to us in bread and wine with pure forgiveness. You and I cannot deal with our own guilt, but Jesus can. You and I cannot rid ourselves of our anger, but Jesus can. You and I cannot overcome sin, temptation, and depression, but Jesus can. You and I are not able to defeat death and the grave, but Jesus defeated these enemies for us. He did all this for the two disciples from Emmaus, and He can, and does, do all this for us.
