#### From the Pastor... (Christmas Eve sermon)

We hear the words of the angel to the shepherds in Luke 2: "Fear not...for unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you: Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger."

These shepherds were more than shepherds. They were shepherd priests. They tended the sheep which were brought into the temple. To be more specific, they were in charge of the lambs used as sacrifices. These lambs had to be males without blemish. And so these shepherd priests would carefully take these lambs, as

soon as their mothers gave birth, and quickly wrap them in strips of their undergarments, known as swaddling clothes, so that these baby lambs would not become bruised and blemished. And then they would separate these lambs from the rest of the flock by laying them carefully in the feeding trough - the manger.

"Jesus was wrapped in swaddling clothes and placed in a manger because He is your sacrificial Lamb."

These shepherds did this day after day, night after night. And so when the angel told them, "This shall be a sign unto you: Ye shall find the babe *wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger,*" they knew exactly what he meant. This was a sign they understood. The child born that night in the city of David was the holy, unblemished Lamb of God, born to be sacrificed for them and for all sinners.

Whether tonight is your very first Christmas Eve service, or your 90th, or somewhere in between, God wants you tonight to believe that the sign the angel gave to the shepherds is also for you. "Unto you...is born a Savior." Jesus was wrapped in swaddling clothes and placed in a manger because He is your sacrificial Lamb. Unless He had come, you and I would have to pay the price for our disobedience, and that price is separation from God in heaven forever. But He did come - your Savior, the unblemished Lamb of God. He made payment for you. He was born to suffer your punishment. Friend, God forgives you. He is at peace in His heart with you. I know your life is blemished; so is mine. But the unblemished Lamb was born to be sacrificed for you. If you are a sinner, one thing is absolutely certain - you are a forgiven sinner. God says so. "Unto you...is born a Savior, Christ the Lord!" This is glad tidings of great joy, and it's yours now at Christmas and always. Merry Christmas.



# News from the Trustees

Chairman – Kelly Latham – 2<sup>nd</sup> year, George Baravik – 1<sup>st</sup> year, Bill Warnecke – 3<sup>rd</sup> year

Over the past year, the Trustees made some progress on a few projects, most notably:

Furnace Replacement – There are four furnaces and air conditioners that heat and cool the church and education building. During the preventive maintenance winter tune-up, a decision quickly needed to be made on the two furnaces in the church basement due to cold weather coming. Since the air conditioners still worked, it was decided to replace the two furnaces only and also improve the ductwork for proper airflow. An added benefit of this configuration will allow future replacement of the air conditioners when the time comes. The cost for this equipment was approximately \$5,685. Funds for this equipment are reserved in the endowment fund.

Looking to the future, the Trustees hope to make more progress on the goals remaining from last year while adding more to the list. Due to funding, timing, and volunteer availability, we are not promising to complete all these projects but we are communicating the needs. In no particular order, the goals are:

- Install a new playground dusk to dawn pole and light. (Estimated cost \$750.)
- Pour concrete in front of the parsonage garage. (This is Phase III of the parking lot. Estimated cost \$2,500. Finishing this will complete the parking lot project.)
- Replace the parsonage cellar door. (Estimated cost \$600.)
- Painting (kitchen and basement bathroom floors, touch up at various locations, metal doors, back entrance walkway and stairs, and a few others.)

To inform the congregation of items that will require much more investment, here is the 2-5 year out Long Term Project List.

- HVAC Replace the air conditioning units in the church basement. (Estimated cost is \$6,000 \$9,000 for 2 units depending on the efficiency and style.)
- Steeple Painting Have a bid to repaint for approx. \$10,000.
- Parking Lot Sealing and Restriping Estimated cost is \$6,000.
- West Entry Deck Will need to seek bids to replace since this structure is near the end of its life.

There will always be little projects that come up throughout the year that must be dealt with. As we work to complete these projects on the list, or other projects come along, we may ask for extra hands to help out. Again, we do want to thank all of those who have given of their time, skill, or donations to make these improvements possible and we hope for continued support in the future.
