From the Pastor... (message from the Augusta Memorial Day Service)

This used to be called Decoration Day. Now it's called Memorial Day - a day to remember; to remember those who gave everything in service to their country. That's not why they did it. These men and women did not lay down their lives so that we would remember them. They did not die with the thought: "At least on Memorial Day we will be remembered." Even if we would not remember, they still would have given their lives for us. It's called honor, loyalty, integrity. If we do not remember the second the s

ber, we are the ones to be pitied...not them.

It's good, therefore, that you are here today. You have given up your time and made the effort to come out to this cemetery to be a part of this. It's not as if you couldn't remember from the comfort of your living room. But you couldn't do that, could you?

These brave men and women did not stay in their comfort zones. They entered the battlefield for you. The least we can do is get off our couch and stand here together to remember them.

So today we remember. But those we remember are not aware of us. When a soldier is dying on the battlefield, his comrades may say to him: "We will always remember you and what you did." But it's never the other way around. The comrades do not ask the one who is dying to remember them. The living remember those who have died. Why would the living ask the dying to remember them?

It happened once...on the greatest battlefield of them all. A thief hanging from a cross asked Jesus, who would soon be dead, to remember him. "Jesus," he asked, "remember me." In the Greek the name Jesus means Savior. So what this thief was saying was, "Savior, remember me." And Jesus promised to never forget him. "Today," He told him, "you will be with Me in Paradise."

That thief did not deserve to be remembered...unlike the brave men and women we remember today. But this is our God. He is no respecter of persons. He doesn't care how good or how bad we have been; how brave or how timid. He went to the battlefield of Calvary for you, my friend, to take your place on a cross; to endure the penalty of death, yes, eternal death, which we all deserve. He did this for everyone of you purely out of love for you.

Jesus is the only Soldier who came back from the battlefield after giving His life there. That's why He is the Savior, your Savior. All the brave men and women who fought and died for us are saviors with a small "s." Jesus is the Savior with a capitol "S," for He saves us from sin, death, and hell, and nothing else does.

So yes, this is Memorial Day, and we are here to remember. But our remembering will end the day we die. It is Jesus who takes us beyond the grave into Paradise. And so even as we remember those who fought and died for us, on this Memorial Day, we turn, with the thief to Jesus, and say, "Savior, remember me."


