From the Pastor...

If you were to attend a daily chapel service at our seminary in St. Louis or Ft. Wayne, you would see young men streaming in, and all of them pausing at the baptismal font to dip their finger into the water and then apply it to their forehead in the shape of the cross. Our future pastors are being taught to keep their baptism before them every day of their life.

This is something we, too, need to be taught. A husband wears his wedding ring as a physical reminder that he is united to his wife. The water of

the font traced upon our forehead in the shape of the cross is just such a physical reminder. This is not a "re-baptizing," but a return to our baptism. For most of us, it was many years ago that the sign of the cross was made on our forehead

and heart as water was poured on our head. God, on that day, attached His grace, the forgiveness of sins, to the physical water. If His grace was only for that day in our life, you and I would not need to be reminded of it. But the joy of baptism is that it stands forever. Scripture clearly testifies, as it does in Romans 6, that we who are baptized into Christ, live under grace, in union with Jesus, every single day of our life.

But here is the challenge for us. A husband and wife wear rings as a reminder of their union. What do we Christians have as a physical reminder of our union to Jesus Christ in Holy Baptism? This is where the sign of the cross comes in which we can make over our hearts day after day. This is where the water in the font comes in which we can apply to our forehead. Understanding the wonderful meaning behind this simple act, the Elders thought it would be a good thing to always have water in the font for our use. The lid will be removed during each service for those who want to apply the water to their forehead. Because this is a reminder of God's grace, this is not given by way of command, but by way of encouragement.

This is the Spirit's entry now; The water and the Word, The cross of Jesus on your brow The seal both felt and heard. Let water be the sacred sign That we must die each day To rise again by His design As followers of His way.


