From the Pastor...

"Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also (Matthew 6)." As Lent approaches, we need to focus on these words of our Lord. If we are being honest, we must admit that our treasure lies within this world. Consider where you spend your time, your money, your effort. We may say we treasure Jesus and His kingdom most of all, but our actions contradict what we say. We do not seek His kingdom first. We seek what this world can offer us. Our way of life, therefore, is a lie. Our religion, in many ways, is fake. We must repent.

Do not fear. For the very words that condemn you also give you pardon and peace. Lent is not about what you do; it's about what God does; about what God has done to forgive you. And so we ask this question of God: where is His treasure? For where His treasure is, there His heart is also. Friend,

you are God's treasure. Jesus calls you a hidden treasure, a pearl of great price. You are a treasure in the eyes of your God not because of anything in you; not because of anything you do for God. God treasures you because of who He is. He is the friend of sinners. Like the woman caught in adultery upon whom Jesus had mercy; like the prodigal son who was shown mercy by his father; the thief on the cross; Zaccheus; Peter... each one of these sinners God treasured, just as He treasures you. "And where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." Lent shows us most clearly the heart of God. His heart is beating upon a cross; it's beating for you because you are His treasure.

Jesus, I will ponder now on Your holy passion; with Your Spirit me endow for such meditation.
Grant that I in love and faith may the image cherish of Your suffering, pain, and death, that I may not perish. Amen.



Reformation 2017

This logo takes many elements from Luther's seal, which is the most easily recognized symbol for Lutheranism. It was common in Lu-

ther's day for people to create a seal or coat of arms for their families, and that seal told the world what the family cared about or did for a living. It's no surprise, then, that Luther's seal was all about Jesus!



At the center of Luther's seal, and at the center of the Reformation 2017 logo, is a red heart in the middle of a white rose. (The heart and rose together are commonly referred to as Luther's rose.) As Luther explained in one of his writings, "The heart in the middle of the white rose shows that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace. It immediately sets [the believer] into the midst of a white, joyful rose, not like the peace and joy the world offers. That is why the rose should be white, not red. White is the color of the spirits and all angels."

At the center of that rose is Jesus Christ and Him crucified. Jesus is the center and Rock of our faith. He has been since He came to Earth in the flesh, and He still is today. The word "still" bears witness to the ever and ongoing relevance of this one, saving truth for sinners.
