From the Pastor...

There is only one church, but there are two kinds of saints: militant saints and triumphant saints. If you look in the hymnal you will find these listed as The Church Militant, and The Church Triumphant. "A Mighty Fortress," and "Onward, Christian Soldiers" are among the hymns in the Church Militant section. The Church Triumphant section contains hymns such as "For All the Saints," and "Behold, A Host Arrayed in White." Just by reading through the words of these hymns, even a visitor could likely figure out how militant saints differ from triumphant saints. The saints triumphant have finished their course here on earth and are at rest with Christ in

heaven. The saints militant are still in the fight here on earth. The problem which exists for us is that we who are saints militant act as if we were saints triumphant.

This is not to say that we imagine ourselves to be in heaven already. What I mean is that we--who are still fighting against our sinful desires, against the sinful world all around us, against the devil who tempts us relentlessly--act as though the fight is over. We lay aside our weapons and take our rest. We busy ourselves with our families, our jobs, and our hobbies, but the weapons of the Spirit--which are God's Word and Sacraments--we lay off to the side.

What is a soldier called who lays his weapons aside and takes his rest while the enemy is still attacking? A deserter! That's exactly what we are when we fail to take up the Word of God and read and study it. That's what we are when we fail to bring ourselves and our families to God's House regularly. That's what we are when we have a "take-it-or-leave-it" attitude toward Christ's holy body and blood in the Sacrament.

Deserters in the army face stiff punishment, and in the past were even lined up before a firing squad. Deserters in the church do not just offend God, they offend the faithful, and they are to be dealt with so that others do not follow into their wickedness. Saints who are not militant--who do not fight with the weapons God gives us-will not become saints triumphant.

Jesus is no deserter. He did not run away when the horrors of Good Friday approached. He finished His course here on earth. He stayed in the fight. "It is finished!" He cried in triumph from the cross. Yet the good news for us is that Jesus was declared a deserter in our place. He was punished for our desertions because He took our place under the Law. God called His Son the deserter so that you He calls His forgiven one.

So take up your weapons and fight, for it is Jesus who fights for you. Learn from Him how to fight, how to finish your course here on earth, and one day you will join the saints triumphant in eternal rest and joy.


