From the Pastor...

"You are dust, and to dust you shall return." These words from Genesis 3 will be before us once again as Ash Wednesday quickly approaches, even though this year we will not be imposing the ashes on the forehead. The first time these words were heard, Adam and Eve would not have realized their full impact. They had not yet laid the body of their son, Abel, to rest within the ground. Upon his death, however, these words of God would have clearly and painfully been remembered.

Just as it has been done, so too when you are buried, your pastor will speak these words to those who gather at your gravesite. The pain of death cannot be avoided and in fact we must let these words have their say. Those who hide themselves from death are attempting to close the

mouth of God's Law. But the Law speaks truthfully. All of us are but dust and ashes. And we will all one day return to the ground from whence we came.

Yet the Law does not have the final say. Even before God spoke to Adam and Eve about their return to the dust, He promised to provide a Savior. This Savior, Jesus, is God's final word. The reason we, as Christians, hold the season of Lent in such high regard is that it brings us, year after year, into the sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. He journeyed to the cross for you. Lent is for you because Jesus and His cross are God's final word to you, the word of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

Every year many Christians give up something for Lent. Why not, this year, add something for Lent? If you have not made Wednesday evening Lenten services a part of your life in the past, this year add them to your schedule. Or add the watching of these services, for they will be recorded as are all the Sunday services. Consider also adding more time in the Scriptures. Through Lent read a little more of God's Word each day. Do we have to do these things during Lent? No. But why wouldn't we want to have more of Jesus? He is, after all, God's final word to us. He is what Lent, and life, is all about.



Meditation

The face reveals the true identity of a person, but even more, it shows us either love or anger, joy or sadness, acceptance or rejection. We see the face of God only by looking at the cross of Jesus. There we see God as He wants us to know Him--not as an angry God who rejects us for our sins, but as a God who has love for sinners, who is so full of compassion that He Himself bears the sin of the world and declares all sinners forgiven. God does not hide this merciful face of His from us, but desires that all see Him as the One who is "full of grace and truth."

Lent Begins on February 17

Ash Wednesday is February 17 and marks the beginning of this Lenten season. Lenten services will be held each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. (please note the time change from previous years).

During the 40 days of Lent, God's baptized people cleanse their hearts through the discipline of Lent: repentance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Lent is a time in which God's people prepare with joy for the Paschal Feast (Easter).
