From the Pastor's Desk...

(The following is the Lenten sermon from March 25)

I was a few hours away from hell. Not only was it my last day on earth; it was my last opportunity to repent. My life had been hideous. I was a taker, never a giver. I stole, I robbed. A thief, they branded me. Eventually I was caught. They led me out to Calvary early on a Friday morning. I was to die by crucifixion. There were three of us. I, my partner in crime, and Jesus. The king of the Jews, they called Him. But He did not look like a king. Bloodied, beaten, stripped of His clothing...He was raised up on a cross just like me. They made fun of Him--those who passed by. *"If you are the Son of God,"* they said laughing, *"save yourself!"* I joined in with them. I was scared, afraid to die, afraid to face my God in the Judgment. So I mocked Him, this Jesus of Nazareth. Somehow it


made me feel better.

But then He spoke. He was praying...praying for His crucifiers. "*Father*," He cried, "*forgive them...*" What manner of man was this? I wondered, to forgive those who are torturing you to death! My partner kept at it, but I stopped "Truly I say to you...today you shall be with Me in Paradise."

mocking Him. Instead, I was thinking; thinking about Jesus. He spoke again, to His mother. He was kind. He spoke with love. I began to see myself for who I was. My past life sickened me. I was wretched. There was nothing good about me. And I began to see Jesus for who He was. He was a king. But not some earthly king; a heavenly king. This was the Son of God hanging next to me! I would never have believed it, except that when He spoke, His words did something to me. They went to my heart.

I turned to Him and spoke. He was all I had. He could save me; not from my death that day--from hell. Jesus could save me from hell. "Jesus," I kept saying, "remember me when you come into your kingdom." He turned. My king turned to look at me. His face was a mess. Ugly with blood. But His eyes melted my heart. And His words brought to me tears of joy. "Truly I say to you," He was speaking to me! "Today you shall be with Me in Paradise."

My king, my Savior. He knew I was a thief. But He turned to me. My life, my whole wretched life was forgiven. I was going to heaven, and my sinfulness could not prevent it! Jesus will not leave me to die alone. He will not leave me to hell and Satan. He will take me...me! to Paradise with Him. My heart was singing. I wanted to wrap my arms around Him and hug Him, if only I could. I loved Jesus. His were the most beautiful words anyone ever spoke to me. And I believed them. A few hours later Jesus died. I cried when He died, for He was my best Friend. But I had hope, and confidence. I knew where He was. He went to heaven to remember me. And I, soon, very soon, would join Him there. I thought of my mother. How many tears she would have cried over me. How often she must have prayed for me. But mom, I was thinking, it's okay! I'm going to heaven to be with Jesus! Oh, I wish I could have lived my life over. I would have lived, not as a rebel, but as one who loves God, who lives with Him as my king. But it wasn't to be. If I had had the chance, I would have told the whole city, the whole world about Jesus. That they have a Savior, too, no matter how they have lived.

But you are here tonight, and you are hearing my story. You may not be a thief and a robber, but you are a sinner. You need Jesus, too. And He's yours. There isn't anyone who has lived so badly that they are beyond Jesus' help. God forgives you too, just like He forgave me. Paradise is for you, too. Your sins cannot keep you out. That's why Jesus died...to be your Savior.

When the soldiers came and broke my legs, I had minutes to live, if that. But I clung to Jesus' words. I clung to His promise. It was for me. And it's for you. Go, live your life. Serve your king. And cling to His words. You won't die on a cross like I did. But when you die, you, like me, will go to Paradise. Because of Jesus, my friend, because of Jesus.
