From the Pastor's Desk...

"It is finished!" John 19:30

††Here are some of the most beautiful words ever uttered, and yet we struggle with them. Our sinful flesh hears these words of Christ and simply refuses to believe them. For you and I are born believing that our salvation is not finished. Our sinful flesh tells us, again and again, that we ourselves must finish it. Each day people by the scores go to their graves hoping against hope that they have lived well enough before God to finish it—to cause Him to let them into heaven.

Even among the Baptized, many lay upon their deathbeds wondering if they really are heading to heaven. "Perhaps I have not done enough to finish the task. Perhaps my 'bad' outweighs my 'good.' Perhaps my salvation

is still undecided." These thoughts do not just torment the dying—they may be tormenting you right now.

Friend, such thoughts are not of God, but are of Satan. Just as the Tempter convinced Eve in the Garden to doubt what God had truly

said, so he tries to convince us that Jesus did not truly finish what He came to do; that our salvation depends on what we do, and not on what Jesus did for us. But it is Satan who is the liar, not our Lord. Jesus speaks the truth when He says, "It is finished!" Through His perfect life, sufferings, and death, eternal life is granted as a gift to all who believe in Him. You and I cannot finish what Christ has already finished. We can only receive what He has finished. And so in Baptism, in the Lord's Supper, in the words of the Gospel, Jesus gives you salvation; the salvation that He finished for you on the cross.

O perfect life of love! All, all is finished now. All that He left His throne above to do for us below. No work is left undone of all the Father willed; His toil, His sorrows, one by one, the Scriptures have fulfilled. In perfect love He dies; for me He dies, for me. O all-atoning Sacrifice, I cling by faith to Thee. Amen


