From the Pastor...

"In Christianity," writes Wilhelm Loehe, "the ordinary has become extraordinary, the usual unusual, the common uncommon." God's people do extraordinary, unusual, uncommon things; yet, what they do is quite ordinary, usual, and common. Take the prophet Daniel for example. In Daniel 6, we see him being tossed into the lion's den. This beloved Bible story truly shows what a hero of faith he was. But looking at this story a little more closely, we see Daniel doing only what was ordinary and common. An edict was passed

proclaiming that no one in the kingdom could pray to any god or man for thirty days except to the king. After learning of this edict, Daniel went about his usual custom of praying to the true, living God three times a day. For this, he was tossed to the lions. But God shut the lion's mouths, keeping Daniel safe from harm. The next morning, when the king came

near to the den, Daniel, when asked, explained that God sent His angel to protect him. An extraordinary story! Yet, Daniel only does what is ordinary and common - He continues to pray to and worship God.

Let me say here that you, dear fellow Christians, are extraordinary, unusual, and uncommon, not because you do extraordinary, unusual, and uncommon things, but because you continue to be like Daniel. Your *usual* manner is to pray each day to God; to set aside a little time each day for His Word; to set aside Sunday mornings to come to His House to hear the Word and receive the Sacrament. These are common, ordinary things. But in the eyes of God, they are extraordinary, unusual, and uncommon.

In Matthew 25, Jesus tells us that when He returns, He will usher His sheep into heaven not because they did extraordinary things, but because they did ordinary things like welcoming in strangers, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and those in prison. But because these common things were done as the fruits of faith, God declares them to be extraordinary, unusual, and uncommon.

It can seem mundane to us to continue doing those things which are so common. But how uncommon it is to continue doing these things "even unto death." How unusual to faithfully persevere in what we usually do as God's people. How extraordinary to make the ordinary our pattern for living.


