### From the Pastor...

"And taking the five loaves...He gave them to His disciples to set before the people" (Mark 6:41).

Jesus could have filled those 5,000+ people by speaking a word; but He didn't. He could have had the people come up to fill their plates; but He didn't. Jesus used His disciples. He gave the food to them to give to the people. This made them waiters. The waiter doesn't prepare the food; he serves it. When you go to a restaurant, you don't even see the chef. He is in the kitchen slaving over a hot stove preparing your

meal. You see the waiter who brings out the food to you.

Jesus uses His pastors in the way that He used the disciples. Your pastor is simply a waiter. He doesn't prepare your meal. He doesn't slave away in the kitchen. Je-

sus prepared your meal; He is, in fact, the meal. Jesus became a slave, a servant for your sake. He prepared the meal of grace by His sufferings, death, and resurrection. It was prepared on a cross, but it's not served there. The meal is served in the restaurant of His holy house and at His holy table. You don't see the one in the kitchen; you see the waiter. Your pastor stands before you in the pulpit, at the lectern, and before the altar. He is called to serve the food of life Jesus prepared for you.

The pastor is never to think that he can improve the meal Jesus has prepared. The pastor is not to try to embellish the food, add to it, or take away from it. His task is to serve the food exactly as Jesus has prepared it. This was the task of the disciples when the five thousand were fed. They had one task: give the food Jesus handed to them to the people. It is not for the pastor to try to "out-think" Jesus; to "improve" on His design. Those who do will be called to account on the Last Day. Jesus wants nothing more, and nothing less, than that His meal should be given to His people exactly as He has prepared it.

So, yes, you will hear the same things over and over from the pulpit. You will sing the same hymns, and use the same liturgies through the course of the Church Year. We might add salt and pepper to our plate, but the meal remains the same throughout all generations. The Gospel of salvation is to be kept pure. Pray that your waiter serves this blessed meal to you Sunday after Sunday. Pray that you, with all our members, have the godly desire to devour this meal as often as it is served.

Lord Jesus Christ, we humbly pray that we may feast on You today; Beneath these forms of bread and wine enrich us with Your grace divine.

Give us, who share this wondrous food, Your body broken and Your blood, the grateful peace of sins forgiv'n, the certain joys of heirs of heav'n.


