From the Pastor...

"You hate all evildoers." Psalm 5:5

We're okay with saying that God hates sin, but the Bible says that God hates all evildoers. This bothers us. God is love, says the Bible. How can He hate anyone? We must understand that God's love is not an emotion; it's a person. God's love is Jesus. We cannot speak of God's love apart from Christ. This is always how the Bible speaks of God's love. It connects it to Jesus. In

Romans 5..."In this is love...Christ died for us." In John 3..."For God loved the world in this, that He gave His only Son."

Which God do you have...a God who loves you, or a God who hates you? If God hated you, then why did He bring you to Jesus in your

baptism? If God hated you, then why does He draw you to where His Word is delivered, His forgiveness is given, and His Sacrament is placed into your mouth? God loved the world in Christ. A world full of evildoers He loved by sending His Son to the cross for all. No sinner was excluded. No sin was left behind. Christ died for all sinners. The evil of every evildoer was borne by Him on the cross. And in that moment we can truthfully say that God hated His Son. "My God!" Jesus cried, "Why have you forsaken Me!" God turned His back on Jesus. He punished Him severely. At that moment in time as Jesus hung on the cross, He was the only evildoer in the entire world, and God hated Him, for He was covered with every sin, every act of selfishness, every act of immorality. "He became sin for us," the Bible says.

But then it was finished. Jesus died and rose again. And now when we look at Jesus, we see the love of God for us. And since Jesus is God's love, and since Baptism is Christ, and the Lord's Supper is Christ, and the Word of the Gospel is Christ...God's love is indeed something we can grasp, something we can taste, and handle. God's love was poured out upon your head when you were baptized. God's love is placed into your mouth at the Communion Table. God's love is put into your ears as you sit in the pew. No hate here. Only love, God's love--Jesus, for you.

Thank You, Lord, for revealing Your love to me in the cross of Jesus. Amen.


